Facilitation and Minutes: John McPherson, Ann Green Communications, Inc.

The November meeting of the Murphy Oil USA, Inc. Superior Refinery Community Advisory Panel was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by facilitator John McPherson. The meeting was held at the WITC Conference Center on November 9, 2006. John reviewed the meeting agenda. Minutes of the October meeting were approved as distributed.

Refinery Report

Dave Podratz reported for Murphy Oil, Inc and the Superior Refinery. A copy of Dave's report is included with these minutes, summarized as follows:

Environment:

- There were no spills during the reporting period.
- No air events were reported.
- There were no water exceedances
- One odor complaint was received; and SO₂ odor in the area of the airport. Operations at the plant were normal at the time.

Safety:

- There were no safety incidents.

Operations: The refinery continues to operate at high levels, over 35,000 barrels per day.

Other: The previously discussed reporting WWTP “violation” issue with WDEP has been cleared up.

Community Reporting:

There was discussion about issues surrounding the refinery’s purchase of nearby property. Some in the area have become concerned about potential encroachment of refinery expansion. This concern has been aggravated by at least one company soliciting in the area. [A copy of this letter is included with these minutes.] Dave Podratz said that the concern is entirely out of proportion – that there is no wholesale purchase of property in the offing and that any expansion still remains just a possibility. Even should expansion occur it is unlikely that that company would encroach on the neighborhood or purchase large numbers of homes. Dave said a few concerned citizens were coming to meet with him at WITC following the CAP meeting.

Presentation – Canadian Oil Sands and Refinery Raw Material

Dave Podratz presented information about the Canadian Oil Sands, the source of raw material for the Superior refinery. A copy of the presentation is included with these minutes. Discussion included information about the potential reserves in North America from oil shale and oil sands, methods for retrieving material from geologic structures, the type of material recovered, and means of refining and/or transportation.

It was noted that the next meeting will be held in the Bong Center, as the WITC is unavailable in January.
